Only one proposed amendment to the Department By-Laws was submitted prior to the April 15th deadline. This proposal would restore the number of meetings of the Council of Administration to monthly as was the practice several years ago and reads as follows:

"Proposed New Section 3: Meetings. The Department Council of Administration shall meet at least once a month with the

exception of the month of July, and no funds may be transferred between the May and August Council of Administration meetings except as may be approved by the members of the Department Council of Administration at a special meeting called by the Commander for such purpose." A two-thirds vote of the delegates voting at the Department Convention is necessary to adopt this proposed change and as of the date of this column, the By-Law and Resolutions Committee has not had an opportunity to make its recommendation. The Committee's report will be submitted to the Convention delegates.

How to clean hands with soap and water:

- 1. Wet hands with warm water
- 2. Add soap to make lather
- 3. Rub palms, back of hands and between fingers vigorously
- 4. Rub at least 15 seconds
- 5. Thoroughly rinse and dry hands well

When using alcohol-based hand sanitizes:

- 1. Apply to palm of one hand
- 2. Rub palms, back of hands and between fingers vigorously

3. Rub until hands are dry. If it does not take at least 30 seconds you may need to add more alcohol hand sanitizer

When to clean hands, clean hands before:

- 1. Eating or preparing food (use soap and water)
- 2. Caring for someone who is sick
- 3. Treating a cut or wound
- 4. Visiting a patient's room

When to clean hands, clean hands after

- 1. Going to the bathroom (use soap and water)
- 2. Handling animal waste (use soap and water)
- 3. Changing diapers or helping someone with toileting (use soap and water)
- 4. Caring for someone sick.
- 5. Blowing your nose
- 6. Coughing or sneezing
- 7. Touching garbage
- 8. Touching an animal.
- 9. Treating a cut or wound
- 10. Leaving a patients room


