Comrades, Sisters and Brothers,

My Wife Penny and I wish you and yours a Happy, Healthy, and Prosperous 2018. We sincerely hope your Holiday met all of your expectations.

It's difficult to grasp that my tenure as your State Commander is half over. Membership as of December 17, 2017, this writing, is at 88.08 % with 2,504 members to pay (slightly ahead of where we were last year at the same time). We have time to work on this, but we have to really work at obtaining my state goal of 95% for February 28th 2018. We only have four (4) posts that have reached 100%, and there are 6 posts needing 5 or less....3 of which only need 1. Use the State sponsored 1 Year Look See Program or the 50/50 Life Program to get those new members, and work your 30, 60, and 90 day lists to keep those already on board.. Early in the year it was stated that to qualify for a 100% jacket, 100% membership had to be obtained by February 28, 2017 due to the subscription dues program. Jackets will be awarded at the Convention. Keep on top of your programs and keep recruiting. I would love to be giving out 50 or more jackets.


