Although the Department of Maryland attained over 100% in membership for 2016-17, Nationally only 97.72% membership was attained losing another 28,038 comrades during the year. Comrades,

The Department 50% Life Membership Program is going well. I would just like to repeat that we discourage the use of a credit card to pay the Vet-D. Harvey Cunningham erans half. The Department cannot process credit cards.

Credit Cards cannot be used online with national for the 50% program, which means they have to be sent to National for processing. This can sometimes take over a month. As of the end of May, 2017 we have 332 new or Converted Life Members. The total cost as of May 31, 2017 is \$52,727.61. The Council of Administration approved the program for a 3 year period at a maximum expense of \$50,000.00. As you can see the original \$50,000.00 has been exhausted and the program was refunded for another \$50,000.00 at the May Council of Administration Meeting. This funding had to be withdrawn from our investment Account. As of this writing the 50% Life Member Program is funded and ready to go for this year.

distractions. We have to stay vigilant about the matters that affect us. We recently had an "Action Alert" to contact our representatives to support the bill to expand caregivers' benefits to not only Post 9-11veterans, but to all eras of veterans. This is an important piece of legislation that provides financial resources to veterans so that they can remain in their homes. We are partnering with Maryland Student Veterans of America (SVA) chapters on the issue of GI Bill improvements. Please help us support this legislation by contacting your representatives.

H.R.2068, the Department of Veterans Affairs Education Relief and Restoration Act of 2017, which would ensure all student veterans using GI Bill benefits have their benefits restored when the school they are attending is abruptly closed, similar to their civilian counterparts using Department of Education programs.

**S.798**, the Yellow Ribbon Improvement Act of 2017, which would expand the VA Yellow Ribbon Program to the dependents of veterans who die in the line of duty, thus helping them achieve their educational goals.

H.R.1379 or S.882, the Purple Heart GI Bill Act, which would grant full GI Bill eligibility to Purple Heart recipients regardless of their time on active duty.

H.R.1384 or S.667, the Reserve Component Benefits Parity Act, which would ensure Guardsmen and Reservists who are called to active duty receive the same benefits as their active duty counterpart.
