

# **Motor Vehicle Theft and Safety Prevention**

The purpose of this alert is to provide some suggestions that can reduce your chance of becoming a victim of this type of crime. There are many ways to keep you and your vehicle safe. These are just a few suggestions:

- Never leave your keys in your vehicle. If a thief steals your vehicle with the keys inside, they may have the keys to your home, as well as another vehicle.
- Never leave valuables or any packages visible in your vehicle.
- Park in busy, well lit areas of the parking lot.
- Copy your license plate and vehicle information (VIN) numbers on a card and keep them with you. If your vehicle is stolen, the police will need this information to take a report.
- If you have a garage, use it. When parked in a garage, lock the garage as well as your vehicle, and take your keys inside.
- Never leave your vehicle running while parked inside of a garage to warm up. This could be dangerous due to the carbon monoxide that builds as the car idles in an enclosed space.
- Never leave your vehicle running unattended. Vehicles are commonly stolen at ATMs, convenience stores, and gas stations etc. Many vehicles are also stolen on cold mornings when the owner leaves the vehicle running to warm it up.
- Traffic Article 21-1101(A) states that it is unlawful to leave an unattended vehicle w/o stopping the engine, locking the ignition, removing the key and setting the brake. Fine is \$70 and a 1 point violation.

As always, call 9-1-1 if you see anyone attempting to break into a vehicle. **Do not intervene**, contact 9-1-1 immediately. Provide as much information about the suspect as possible to help the police. Delegates at the recent VFW National Convention considered 14 Proposed amendments to the National By-Laws, 17 to the Manual of Procedure and 5 to the Ritual. 5 amendments to the By-Laws, 11 amendments to the Manual of Procedure and 4 amendments to the

amendments to the Ritual were approved and are now in effect. Sec. 717-Dues Reserve was amended by deleting Posts from that requirement. The delegates also voted to replace Demeter's Manual of Parliamentary Procedure with the more widely used Roberts Rules of Order. Sections 416 and 516 were amended to reduce the time limit for officers, chairmen and committee members to provide proof of eligibility from 60 days to 30 days. The Ritual was amended by deleting "all persons not members of the VFW" from Opening Post Ceremonies and replacing it with "Unauthorized guests". Sec. 1004- of Article X, Rules of Order was amended by adding a revised Order of Business for Post meetings. Due to the adoption of Roberts Rules of Order in place of Demeter's. all Posts are

urged to purchase a copy of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised 11th Edition in addition to the newly revised National By\_laws when available.






NMHM volunteers conduct outreach activities, lead tours of exhibits, or support public programs.
