Hello Comrades,

I hope this finds you all doing well, in your homes and in your posts.

Please be aware of the new virus among us. Please get the vaccination if you feel the need to, always protect yourself and family first. It's the season to be traveling so please use extra caution in your surroundings to protect your family and self when going to different states or countries.

Stay focused on your surroundings this time of the year. Please keep in mind the symptoms of heat exhaustion and the signs of an apparent heat stroke.

HEAT EXHAUSTION- There are two types of heat exhaustion: **Water depletion**. Signs include excessive thirst, weakness, headache, and loss of consciousness.

Salt depletion. Signs include nausea and vomiting, muscle cramps, and dizziness.

Although heat exhaustion isn't as serious as heat stroke, it isn't something to be taken lightly. Without proper intervention, heat exhaustion can progress to heat stroke, which can damage the brain and other vital organs, and even cause death.

HEAT STROKE- Extremely high body temp, dizziness or fainting, rapid heartbeat, disoriented or confusion, nausea, headache most likely throbbing, lack of sweat, hot dry skin, possi-

spoken with so many that are feeling emotional about the situation. Let's remember to prioritize our self-care. In doing so, I'd like to introduce to some and present to others, Mindful Resilience for Compassion Fatigue. Compassion Fatigue occurs when individuals become too physically, emotionally, and mentally exhausted as a result of the demands of their job. If you work in an environment where you experience trauma or if you are a personal caregiver for someone who is recovering from trauma, you can be affected by "Compassion Fatigue". Such signs and symptoms can include feeling overwhelmed and helpless, apathetic behavior, and difficulty concentrating.

If you are experiencing any of the above, these symptoms are not inevitable. Learning to obtain a mindful approach to these events can help you transform your relationships with being a caregiver and with those you love. Let's BREATH and smell the flowers now, from "Compassion Fatigue to Compassion Satisfaction" by prioritizing your self-care. Remember, you are not alone. 
ble seizure, and extreme exhaustion. If not treated could lead to a pine box.

Please continue to set up blood drives, diabetic screenings, blood pressure clinics, first aide and CPR classes and anything else that will help your members and communities.

We did discuss how Vitamin D deficiency could cause issues with reactions to the Covid vaccine. It is suggested to take D3 for the deficiency that can be detected on a blood test at your doctor's office. Please talk to your healthcare provider about D3. Stay safe out there and hope to see you all soon.

VA SECRETARY APPOINTS **NEW VETERANS LAW JUDGES**

The Department of Veterans Affairs' Board of Veterans' Appeals appointed 20 new Veterans Law Judges to deliver more Veterans appeals decisions — bringing the total to 113 VLJs. Most of the new VLJs will arrive prior to the end of fiscal year 2021, with additional judges to be appointed in fiscal year 2022.

They will further VA's effort to deliver enhanced benefits and services to Veterans.

"Veterans Law Judges are a key part of ensuring Veterans receive the benefits and services they have earned and deserve" said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "Once I swear in the new judges, this puts in place added resources to reduce the appeals inventory."

The judges will receive extensive training from seasoned mentor judges to prepare them for their new responsibilities and will be supported by a cadre of attorney-advisors and professional staff as they adjudicate appeals.



Debbie Tilley, National Membership Program Ambassador, explains that this year's focus will be on **RETENTION**. For Maryland, she set a goal of 3655 and so far, we have retained a little over 1000; therefore, we need approximately 828 more retained members to reach the first goal of 1828 or 50% of our goal of 3655.

Debbie also gave Maryland a GAIN goal of 73 per quarter, with the first quarter ending on October 31, 2021. Our Department made the first quarter goal the week ending August 15, 2021 with a total of 102. For the second quarter goal of 73 due by November 30, 2021, Maryland only needs 44, since we already had 29 towards the second quarter goal. Sounds confusing, but once Ambassador Debbie explained it during a Zoom meeting, it became clear that Maryland was on the way to meeting all the goals set by National.

My message is: Continue to work hard to retain your members while recruiting new additions to your auxiliary. If your dues notices have been sent out, the next step will be to follow-up with phone calls. adoption for those experiencing financial difficulties. Reach out to those members who dropped off the rolls during Covid-19. Remember that Membership is the of the auxiliary!
