men sent away only to return home to unimaginable conditions and lack of respect from a nation. Which did not speak until now in their mid to late 70s. They speak of drinking water with dead bodies floating in the water and hiding under best friends' dead body just to live. Shell Shock, Combat fatigue, and PTSD it does not matter what fancy name they give it, it has always been here. Now on to me and my generation, most lived in denial for years a sign of weakness to not be ok. Three broken marriages the common factor was me. Finally, to seek help mainly because of the constant ring or whistle in my ears enough to cause constant Comrades.

Folded Flags are for old warriors, not my friends or my friend's children! I grew up in a house where children's toy were war relics from years long gone by. World War I veterans who never spoke of the horrors of trench warfare, only to find pictures in a foot locker 90 years later. But Doughboy gasmasks, e-tools that dug trenches in Europe and a sword that served under President Lincoln were played with as children as children's toys. As soon as I was able, I joined the Marine Corps. Great Uncles who served in WWII, who I had rode to church with as a child, now saw a darkness in me after my first couple of deployments. They could speak to me after remaining silent for a generation and not sharing with their own children. Tears over no ammo, bone chilling cold, being told to fix bayonets, and landing on the beaches of Okinawa where the enemy was covered in another's blood hoping you would walk by only to shoot or stab you in the back. Imagine keeping that to yourself for a whole generation. Most WWI veterans did the same for a life time not sharing their stories. Now on to the next generation young

head aches and sleepless nights. Only to be diagnosed with PTSD, TBI, hearing aides at 32, knees, hands, and toes that no longer work properly, constant pain due to nerve damage just to name a few. War does not end with war as Combat veterans we must be here for each other and most are but 22 a day is unacceptable and must be zero. War truly only ends with death. We will carry what we carry until death. Signs are there however do we recognize them, not always. Those that knew you prior to your military service will see it immediately and recognize that you're not the same person they knew. The Darkness I spoke of, others will say demons, most including myself will turn to excessive use of alcohol at times. Some turn to the VA and end up addicted to opioids and pain killers. Only when their prescription ends to turn to illegal drugs. It is



SCAM BLANK IMAGE PHISHING SCAMS

Most email providers have security filters that check emails for malicious links or attachments. You may feel like you can rely on these filters and, as a result, trust that emails sent to your inbox are safe. Unfortunately, cybercriminals can take advantage of this trust by using blank image phishing to bypass security filters.

The scam starts with a fake email that appears to be from DocuSign. The email asks you to review and sign a document as soon as possible and contains an HTML attachment. Instead of an important document, the attachment is a blank SVG with malicious code. Because this code is hidden inside the attachment, the email can bypass security filters. If you download the attachment, the code will redirect you to a malicious website that will prompt you to enter sensitive information. If you enter this information, cybercriminals can use it for their own purposes.

Follow the tips below to stay safe from similar scams:

- Always think before you download an attachment. This type of cyberattack is designed to trick you into downloading attachments impulsively.
- Never click a link or download an attachment in an email that you aren't expecting. While this attack targets DocuSign users, this scam could be used with any organization that manages electronic agreements.

Enable multi-factor authentication (MFA) on your accounts when it is available. MFA adds an extra layer of security and lowers the chance of cybercriminals logging in to your account.

Stop, Look, and Think. Don't be fooled.

Slips & Falls



During the winter season, weather changes can cause slips and falls. Around the state we are beginning to experience more rain and snow changes, so be aware of your surroundings when you are walking:

- Curbs can become slippery in the rain, so be sure of your footing before stepping up onto or down from a curb.
- As leaves begin to fall and accumulate, they can be slippery (particularly when they are wet), so avoid large accumulations of leaves when walking.
- Choose appropriate footwear when it is raining or snowing. Smooth soles and high heels are not conducive when walking in a slippery environment; choose a flat shoe with rubber-type soles with grips for better footing.
- When you enter a building , wipe your feet well to get the excess water and snow off of your shoes. Excess water on shoes will cause slips and falls on tile floors.
